WHAT	Getting ready to read <i>My Brother Sam Is Dead</i> : You will examine words from Chapter 1 and decide which words fit in the following categories: <i>character</i> , <i>setting</i> , <i>conflict</i> , <i>resolution</i> , and <i>unknown</i> . Then, you will generate a set of questions that you have about the novel and make some predictions about what will happen in the novel.

AFTER	After you complete this assignment, think about what you did to complete it. Ask yourself: What is value of making predictions before reading?  As we read the novel, we will revisit your predictions and compare them to what actually happens in the story.
